MCKC BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

May 8, 2007 6:00 p.m.

Edgewood Pub & Grill, Valders, WI

The meeting was called to order at 6:06 p.m.

Old Business

Awards banquet There was a general consensus that the May 2 format (held at MCKC building, pizza and cake) was very successful. 55 people attended the meeting—quite a turnout! Some suggestions to “fine tune” the event (hold the raffle after the awards, use a podium, have some media presentations, etc.) were discussed. The Board would like to have this type of event in 2008 with a planning session to be held in January include the Awards chairperson and the Board. It was felt that serving alcoholic beverages at the clubhouse was a liability. The Top Breeder/Top Show Dog award definitions need to be redone; Kathy volunteered to do this. Jim Powers will provide clarification regarding the wording of the Field Awards. (OPEN)

Tax Status Report Burl reported that the IRS has received our application. The fee for this has increased, however, so the attorney is submitting an additional \$250 (we have already paid \$500). When asked what specific status we have applied for, Burl did not have that file with him. He will notify the Board which it is. (OPEN)

Audit Burl apologized for not having this completed. The Board wants it completed by the June meeting. (OPEN)

Long Range Plan Burl reported that the committee has met twice and is whittling away at the list from the January membership meeting. To date they have come up with these priorities: second gate for large fenced area; office on right side of door in building, then the kitchen could be more of a kitchen; light in large fenced area for night use (on a timer); and new building (costs would seem to be prohibitive at this point). A motion was made, seconded and carried to allow Burl to spend up to \$600 for the second gate in the large fenced area. (OPEN)

Obedience Program and Curriculum Steve read a letter that he had written asking that the Obedience coordinators have the final say on all obedience activities and promotional material. There was a discussion. This is not a personal issue directed to any specific individuals, but a matter of policy. A motion was made, seconded and carried to approve this (7 yes, 1 no, 1 abstaining---paper ballot).

Three letters were read regarding issues with the obedience program. Two were from individuals (one a member, one not) and one was signed by 19 members. They are attached to the minutes in the file.

Steve made a motion that a second person be involved with the website to deal with obedience materials and the retriever training class. There was a second. After discussion, there was a vote and the motion was not carried (3 yes, 5 no, 1 abstaining—show of hands).

One of the above mentioned letters had asked the Board to remove Chris from all website responsibilities. A motion was made and seconded to do so. After discussion, there was a vote and the motion was not carried (2 yes, 6 no, 1 abstaining—show of hands). Chris did agree to remove material regarding an obedience drop-in class put there without permission of the obedience coordinators.

A motion was made, seconded and carried that the website be reviewed at each Board meeting until the Board feels issues are resolved. The vote was 8 yes, 0 no and 1 abstaining (show of hands). (OPEN)

Building usage The written proposal from Diana was reviewed. A motion was made, seconded and carried to have it included in new membership welcome letters and be part of the Policies. (CLOSED)

Expense report Burl would still like to receive suggested forms from event chairs. (OPEN)

Letter to County Board Karleen will ask Jeff Lenz, who presented the motion, to provide the Board with a draft of this letter. (OPEN)

Changing the Phone at the Building After some discussion and explanation of the new system, it was felt that everyone was comfortable with allowing it to function as set up. (CLOSED)

Website Membership List Two ways of limiting access to membership information (i.e., the members page) were explained by Chris. A motion was made, seconded and carried to require use of a password to access this information. It will be one word for all users. Chris will provide this information to Diana who will disseminate the information to the membership via email. (CLOSED)

Valders' Access Jerry reported that Chris Haese has written a document with several questions that would clarify this situation. When more is known, he will bring it back to the Board. (OPEN)

Logo Jerry will meet with Tom Beschta to “fine tune” the logo---taking out the letters BIS, bolding the letters MCKC and the circle. He will then take the logo to Office Max for a letterhead format. This will be presented at the June Board meeting. (OPEN)

Kids 4-H Class Steve proposed that this class---held in preparation for the State 4-H dog show in August, only four sessions and limited to 15 participants---be free to those attending. The Board unanimously voted to do this. We are a club providing education to our community and have a long history of helping the local 4-H training group. AKC requires that we do activities like this, and the IRS requires we do this to satisfy our application for tax exempt status. (CLOSED)

NEW BUSINESS

Passwords The Board directed that all passwords/combinations be on file with the Secretary (e.g., the website, the phone system). This way, in case of dire emergency, access would be available if necessary. (OPEN)

Trainer resumes Bonnie was asked to submit updated OB trainer resumes at the next Board meeting. (OPEN)

The meeting was adjourned at 8:50 p.m.

The new format is likely to prove more attractive to the field than the old format of a special awards banquet.

Motion was made, seconded and voted to drop the Top Hunt Test dog of the year award. Board members on our field committee will have the award taken from our club policies.

Memorial plaques

Steve Lubner had an example of a commemorative ceramic plaque with a baked in photo picture on the surface of the plaque. It looked very nice. They will not stand up to years of exposure to sunlight. We could make them up and display them in a special structure for a \$300.00 donation per plaque.

MCKC BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

June 12, 2007 6:00 p.m.

Time Out Bar & Grill, Manitowoc WI

Old Business

Awards: Jim Powers presented wording from the Field Committee clarifying two parts of the Field Awards. A motion was made, seconded and carried to change the Policies under Section X Trophies and Awards to read **Retriever Field Awards** and **MCKC High Point All-Age Trophy: awarded annually to the retriever receiving the highest number of Open and Amateur All-Age points in AKC licensed field trial competition.** At this time no change was made to the Red Allen Memorial Trophy. These changes are based on the history of the field section of the club. In regard to the Top Show Dog and Top Breeder awards, Sharon Reimann pointed out that no change needs to be made as the Policies already state *The following are for AKC events only* and those two awards are listed under that heading. (CLOSED)

Tax Status Report: Burl had no report. (OPEN)

Audit: Jerry reported that the committee had met and ascertained that all financial records are in order. A motion was made, seconded and carried to accept the report. (CLOSED)

Long Range Plan: Burl had an emailed a report to the Board prior to the meeting with improvement suggestions. (It is attached to the minutes.) Two small items have been taken care of (light and timer for large fenced area and the double gate for the fenced area). Options for a new kitchen and office are still being developed and will be presented at a later time. (OPEN)

Obedience Program and Curriculum: Bonnie reported that, unfortunately, Camp K-9 will not take place due to lack of enrollment. The next session will begin later in July. (OPEN)

Letter to County Board: Karleen had neglected to contact Jeff about this. (OPEN)

Valders' Access: Jerry reported that Chris Haese had sent a letter, but there has not been (and may never) a response. (OPEN)

Logo: Jerry gave copies to Karleen, and they will be kept in the Secretary's possession. A thank you letter will be sent to Tom Beschta. (CLOSED)

Trainers' Resumes: Bonnie presented 15 updated resumes. A motion was made, seconded and carried to accept the resumes of 6 new trainers. Two names were presented for a vote with exceptions to the standard policy. A motion was made, seconded and carried to accept the resume as a head trainer based on her training experience elsewhere and titles on dogs. A motion was made, seconded and not passed for an assistant regarding another who has not met the membership requirement of one year. (CLOSED)

Passwords: At the last meeting it had recommended that the Secretary be "the keeper of passwords." To date the phone passwords, the field combination, and the clubhouse have been given to her.

The membership page of the website now is password sensitive. It has been sent to all members who have email access. Others may contact Diana for it. The rationale for having a password is privacy. That statement will be added to the Policies. (CLOSED)

Website Review: As recommended at the last meeting, the website will be reviewed at each meeting. Burl and Chris are in the process of trying to find a cheaper web-hosting site. There was also a discussion of following the stated policy of having only the Web mistress (or Webmaster) add information to the website. A motion was made, seconded and carried to abide by this and have the calendar information added by the Web mistress. The Web mistress will also be responsible for posting a copy of the calendar at the building as the calendar will be removed. A letter of thanks will be sent to Laurie for helping with this. (OPEN)

New Business

Use of Agility Equipment: Donna Dhein submitted a request to borrow a limited number of pieces of agility equipment for the State 4-H Dog Show to be held August 3-5. Donna is the Agility Judge. A motion was made, seconded and carried to loan the equipment. Donna will be responsible for transporting the equipment and returning it in its original equipment. Karleen will send Donna a letter acknowledging this and listing the equipment. (CLOSED)

Obedience Liability Form: Bonnie asked if this form should be used. The answer was yes for non-members. (CLOSED)

Legislative Alerts: There was a lengthy discussion concerning the need for this. Raising awareness among club members regarding local, state and/or national legislation would seem to be more appropriate rather than the club taking any sort of position. A motion was made, seconded and carried that whenever dog-related legislation occurs in Manitowoc County that that information be put in the newsletter with a contact person for more information. (CLOSED)

Trail-a-thon Team: Karleen proposed that the MCKC make a donation of \$150 to the Friends of Mariner Trail for the August 11, 2007, Trail-a-thon. This amount would sponsor a team of up to 15 walkers (and their dogs). A motion was made, seconded and carried to accept this proposal. Bonnie Liermann will be the contact person for this. Walkers will earn 2 volunteer hours. Information will be posted on the website and in the newsletter. (CLOSED)

CGC Test: A motion was made, seconded and carried to have a CGC Test at a date and time to be determined (and not in conflict with any other building use) with Chris DuBois as the certified tester. It will be held sooner rather than later. (CLOSED)

Need for TDI Certified Dogs: Kay presented a request from Debby Wronkowski's mother, Eileen, for TDI certified dogs to work in hospice situations. This request will be in the newsletter and the website. (CLOSED)

4-H Agility Practice: An email from Val Gengler, club member and head of the State 4-H Dog Show, asking that 4-H students be allowed to practice at the MCKC facility prior to the August dog show was presented. This would be prior to regular MCKC agility classes. She also asked that the students be allowed to use the kitchen for an hour afterwards to practice for the Dog Bowl. This would only be for the rest of June and all of July (6 weeks). A motion was made, seconded and carried to allow this. Karleen will notify Val. The MCKC will also be given a full page ad in the dog show catalog. (CLOSED)

Health Department Food Safety Guidelines: There still exists a fair amount of confusion on what is absolutely required for food stands beginning July 1. Kathy will invite the Health Department to send someone to our next meeting. (OPEN)

Valders' Grounds' Culverts: Jerry presented a motion to allow Jerry Running to investigate redoing the culverts at the Valders' grounds not to exceed \$1000. These monies would come from the Field Improvement Funds. The motion was seconded and carried. (CLOSED)

U.S. Government Monies: Burl presented a *Resolution to Submit Application for the United States Department of Agriculture Direct and Counter Cyclical Payment Program*.
